Student must have at least a 2.5 GPA in his/her major

* If the Archaeology Field Experience is conducted outside the U.S., students can apply to have it accepted as an independent trip that fulfills the CCFE requirement. In this case, a maximum of 3 APLs will be embedded when taken in conjunction with CCFE credit, for a total of 5 APL.

** If the Archaeology Field Experience is not fulfilling CCFE credit, then 5 APL credit will be embedded contingent upon meeting required hours (200 hours) and criteria determined by the Director of Applied Learning.

TOTAL CREDITS TO GRADUATE: 120 (12 APLs)

To receive a degree, each student must satisfy checksheet requirements, earn 120 credit hours, fulfill 12 credits of Applied Learning, have a 2.2 GPA in major courses, and a GPA of 2.0 overall. It is the student's responsibility to work with his/her advisor and monitor progress toward these goals. Some majors and/or minors may have more stringent guidelines.

It is strongly encouraged that a minimum of 6 Applied Learning credits be earned in experiential education taking place outside the traditional classroom setting.
