To receive a degree, each student must satisfy checksheet requirements, earn 120 credit hours, fulfill 12 credits of Applied Learning, have a 2.2 GPA in major courses, and a GPA of 2.0 overall. It is strongly encouraged that a minimum of 6 Applied Learning credits be earned in experiential education taking place outside the traditional classroom setting.
