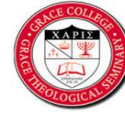

TOTAL CREDITS TO GRADUATE: 120 (12 APLs)

To receive a degree, each student must satisfy checksheet requirements, earn 120 credit hours, fulfill 12 credits of Applied Learning, have a 2.2 GPA in major courses, and a GPA of 2.0 overall. It is the student's responsibility to work with his/her advisor and monitor progress toward these goal. Some majors/minors do have more stringent guidelines.

It is strongly encouraged that a minimum of 6 Applied Learning credits be earned in experiential education taking place outside the traditional classroom setting.
